Min 1: PTA /AGM/ 30/7/2024	ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA The agenda was a unanimously adopted by the members.
Min 2: PTA /AGM/ 30/7/2024	OPENING PRAYER AND ANTHEMS The meeting was called to order at 11:10 a.m. This was followed by the singing of the National, East African, and the College Anthems. The College Head Prefect, Mr. Kayemba Gyaviira, then led the opening prayer.
Min 3: PTA/AGM/ 30/7/2024	CHAIRPERSON'S OPENING REMARKS <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Chairperson warmly welcomed all members to the meeting and commended them for their time management, which enabled the meeting to commence promptly. 2. He extended his appreciation to the P.T.A Executive Committee for their guidance and requested them to introduce themselves to the house. 3. The Chairperson concluded by wishing all members fruitful deliberations.
Min 4: PTA/AGM/ 30/7/2024	REVIEW OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND ACTION REPORT Minutes of the previous meeting were read, corrected and approved as a true record of what transpired in that meeting. The following were the matters that arose; <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Chairperson informed members that the new dormitory block was in use and currently accommodated 320 students. 2. He reported that the construction of the new classroom block was scheduled to commence early in the following year. 3. Members were informed that all classrooms, five student houses, and the hostel were equipped with CCTV cameras.

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. He further noted that a central control room had been established to monitor the CCTV camera network. 5. The Chairperson expressed appreciation to parents who had reported incidents of lost property and emphasized the importance of sensitizing students to be more responsible for their personal belongings. 6. He commended the members of the P.T.A Executive Committee for their punctuality and dedication. 7. Regarding the Peregrine Kibuuka Endowment Foundation, he acknowledged that discussions in the previous meeting had been inconclusive. He assured members that comprehensive details and documentation regarding the Fund would be provided in due course.
<p>Min 5: PTA/AGM/ 30/7/2024</p>	<p>PRESENTATION OF ANNUAL REPORTS</p> <p><u>HEADMASTER'S REPORT</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Opening Remarks; He welcomed all members to the meeting and thanked them for their presence and continued support. 2. Condolences; He expressed sympathy and condolences to all who had lost their loved ones during the year. 3. Appreciation of Staff and Stakeholders <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He thanked Mr. Charles Drake Rubongoya and Mrs. Margaret Kyambadde Namagembe the former Deputies for their dedicated service and contributions to the College. • He appreciated the Director of Studies (D.O.S) and his assistants for their commendable dedication and performance in the absence of Deputy Headteachers. • He recognized the Chaplain for his committed service and congratulated him upon making 17 years as a priest. • Gratitude was extended to the teachers who had retired or been transferred after serving the College with Commitment. • He also thanked the government for the continued support rendered to the College. • Mr. Ikwete Julius and his family were appreciated for handling their son's medical issues diplomatically, noting that the insurance company was yet to honour the school's claim. 4. Staffing Updates; The Headmaster informed members of the arrival of new staff, particularly the posting of two new Deputy Headteachers: i.e Mr. Kakuru Denis – Deputy Headmaster in charge of Administration and Mrs. Mugoya Agnes Namiiro – Deputy Headmaster Academics 5. Student Enrolment; He reported that the student enrolment stood at 1,942 students.

	<p>6. Academic Performance and Progress; The Headmaster appreciated the overall good academic performance recorded in the previous year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He commended the best-performing subjects: Mathematics (core) and ICT (optional), and acknowledged exceptional performance in other subjects such as Christian Religious Education (CRE) and Literature. <p>UACE Performance Summary: 3 Principle passes: 113 students 2 Principle Passes: 10 students 1 Principle Passes: 03 students 0 Principle Pass: 01 student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He was confident that most of the candidates had qualified to join various university courses. • Parents of S6 candidates would be invited to assist their sons in selecting university courses. • Curriculum coverage for candidate classes was reported to be nearly 100%. • MOCK examination results would be included in the End of Term 2 report cards. • Notes checking had been completed across all classes and students had been advised to work harder. <p>7. Discipline and Student Welfare; Parents were urged to clearly label their sons' uniforms and casual clothing to curb theft. They were also encouraged to do Impromptu inspections of student property to ensure they possess only what rightfully belonged to them.</p> <p>8. Counselling Services; Professional counsellors were reported to be meeting students every Saturday to offer guidance and support.</p> <p>9. Student Leadership; He informed members of the newly appointed student leaders: Head Prefect: Kayemba Gyaviira and the Chairman of the Students' Council: Kizito Elijah</p> <p>10. Health Matters; The school had experienced minor health challenges including red eyes and chickenpox. A combination of student isolation and home-based treatment was applied. It was noted that students may not be allowed to leave school as frequently in the next term to enhance uninterrupted learning.</p> <p>11. Spiritual Development; The Headmaster informed members that Lugazi Diocese would host the Uganda Martyrs Day celebrations on 3rd June 2025.</p> <p>12. 12. Co-Curricular Activities</p> <p>a) Sports: PE kits for S1 and S2 students were delivered, and each student received their own kit. The headmaster informed the house of the Sports Day Results: that is 1st</p>
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Place: Billington House, 2nd Place: Doyle House and 3rd Place: Hanlon House

The College received a large assortment of sports equipment from the guest of honour Hon. Dr. Kamara Nicholas, during Sports Day.

b) Music, Dance and Drama (MDD): Biermans House emerged as the winner in MDD competitions and was awarded a bull.

13. **International Exposure;** He announced an upcoming international educational trip to the United Kingdom. There would be only ten slots available for selected students.

14. **Communication and Reporting;** Parents were encouraged to collect hard copies of their sons' academic reports on the first day of the school term if needed.

15. **Technological Advancements;** The College had acquired a biometric system to monitor students' attendance, particularly for morning preparations. This system had significantly improved morning prep attendance.

16. The Headmaster concluded his report by thanking all stakeholders for their continued support and commitment to the success of the College.

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Governors and the College Management, he welcomed all stakeholders to the meeting. The following are the highlights of his report.

1. The Treasurer presented the Audit Report for the year ending 31st December 2023. Key highlights were as follows:

- Income Realized (2023): UGX 1,182,932,501
- Bad Debts Registered: UGX 55,381,700
- He informed members that some outstanding balances remained and needed to be cleared.

2. **ICT Infrastructure;** He emphasized the urgent need to upgrade the College's ICT systems to align with current technological standards.

3. **Basis for Budgeting;** The budget for 2024 was based on the current student population of 1,942, distributed as follows:

4. **Key Achievements; He highlighted the following key achievements**

a) **Staff Welfare:** PTA-funded staff allowances were increased. A 25% salary increment was effected for Arts Teachers to reduce the pay disparity with their Science counterparts.

b) **Infrastructure and Utilities:**

A generator was purchased to support power supply to a large section of the College. • Security: CCTV cameras were installed in classrooms, the hostel, and around the compound to enhance security. <p>5. Closing Remarks; The Treasurer concluded by expressing his gratitude to: The Chairman BOG, College Parents, Staff, Old Boys and all well-wishers. He acknowledged their support in achieving the financial goals and developments of the College. The report marked the conclusion of the Management Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2023.</p>
	<p><u>CHAIRMAN PTA'S REPORT</u></p> <p>The Chairman of the Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) presented his report with the following key highlights:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Opening Remarks; The Chairman warmly welcomed members to the Annual General Meeting (AGM) for the year 2025. He appreciated all parents for attending and for their willingness to deliberate on matters critical to the growth and well-being of their sons. He also introduced the members with whom he served on the PTA Executive Committee since their election. 2. Parenting Responsibilities; The Chairman reminded members that nurturing, supporting, and guiding children remains the primary role of parents. He emphasized the need for vigilance and engagement in parenting during these challenging times marked by competing influences. 3. Key areas addressed included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Peer Influence: Parents were advised to guide their sons in choosing appropriate friends. • Social media and Screen Time: Parents were encouraged to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monitor their sons' use of social media at home. • Set clear limits on screen time. • Promote media literacy and responsible digital behavior. • Parental Engagement: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He urged parents to have open discussions with their sons—understanding their feelings, likes, dislikes, and areas of struggle. • He cautioned against exposing children to parental conflicts.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents were encouraged to show interest in both academic and personal development by visiting their sons during designated school events such as Visitation Days, Sports Days, and Class Days. • He stressed that such involvement boosts students' confidence and reinforces parental support. • Home Monitoring: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He cautioned parents to regulate their children's movements and activities during holidays. • He advised parents to provide adequate pocket money while also instilling values of contentment and financial discipline. <p>4. Communication and Class WhatsApp Groups; The Chairman commended the College staff for creating class WhatsApp groups, which had improved communication between parents and teachers. However, he expressed concern over the inappropriate language sometimes used on these platforms and made the following clarifications:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only matters concerning Namilyango College were to be discussed in the class groups. • Parents and teachers were called upon to maintain decorum and use respectful, logical language. • He emphasized that official communication would always be issued by the Headmaster. • He informed members that all parallel WhatsApp groups were to be merged into one group per class to streamline communication. <p>5. Achievements; The Chairman reported that the PTA Executive, in collaboration with the Board of Governors, had supported the College Administration to accomplish the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Construction of a new dormitory block • Procurement of a generator capable of powering the entire school • Improvement of the main water well • Renovation of the hostel and Reensich House • Painting of: Classroom blocks, Dining hall, Computer laboratory • Installation of CCTV cameras for enhanced security • Phased construction of the perimeter wall <p>6. Upcoming Projects; The following development projects were proposed for implementation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Extension of Dormitory Block: Plans to add another level to the newly constructed dormitory to accommodate 480 students. • Construction of a New Classroom Block
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pitch Drainage Works; Proposed construction of underground water channels to drain the College sports fields. <p>7. Appreciation and Closing Remarks; The Chairman expressed his sincere appreciation to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All parents for attending the PTA/AGM meeting. • The College Administration for the commendable academic performance posted in the previous year. • Class Parent Committees for their ongoing support and complementary role in PTA activities. <p>8. He concluded by wishing all parents a safe journey back home.</p>
<p>Min 6: PTA/AGM/ 30/7/2024</p>	<p>MATTERS ARISING AND COMMUNICATIONS</p> <p>The following matters were raised, discussed, and addressed during the meeting:</p> <p>1. Financial Contributions towards Endowment Fund</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A member proposed that each parent contributes UGX 20,000/= to support school projects. • It was unanimously resolved that each parent contributes UGX 20,000/= towards the Perigrine Kibuuka Endowment Fund. <p>2. Appreciation of Staff</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Members appreciated the care and dedication of teachers Mr. Kanaabi Patrick, Mr. Nsano Ivan, and Mr. Kalula Edward. • Ms. Atuhairwe Claire was also appreciated by some parents. • The Headteacher was commended for introducing the DIY program and the school’s spiritual development efforts. <p>3. Security and Safety</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A member proposed the use of metal detectors to enhance security during AGMs. • A proposal was made to allow boda-bodas on visitation days for parents without vehicles; however, the Headmaster advised against it due to security concerns. • The issue of bullying in S.1 classes was raised. The Headteacher noted that student sensitisation through counsellors had already been carried out. <p>4. ICT and Biometric Systems</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Headmaster confirmed that the ICT policy was already in place and awaiting signing by the Board Chairman. • It was resolved that ICT lessons become compulsory for S.1 students. • A member appreciated the administration for implementing the biometric system for student roll calls. <p>5. Academic and Curriculum Matters</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Chairman clarified that materials sold for the new curriculum were authentic and approved.

- It was reported that S.4 projects had already been completed before the term began.
- The rotation of teachers across streams was proposed, but the Chairman advised against it to maintain consistency.
- The Board was considering a UGX 80,000/= payment for a skills-based program for S.1 and S.2 students.
- A student, Muwonge Farid (S.4), authored a book titled "*How to Play a Guitar*" priced at UGX 50,000/=. Parents were encouraged to support this student-led initiative.

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6. Student Welfare and Discipline

- Concerns were raised regarding school fee defaulters. The Chairman confirmed ongoing efforts to recover the arrears.
- Members discussed discipline management, with a suggestion to reintroduce caning. The Headteacher clarified that caning is outlawed, and school rules would be followed.
- Parents were advised to manage their children's discipline at home, encourage them to eat school meals.
- Drive responsibly and with respect while driving at the College.
- A proposal was made to ban processed food during visitation days. The Headmaster advised against bringing excessive "grab" for students.
- The Headteacher reminded parents to check their sons' property at the end of the term to avoid loss or taking another student's

7. Health and Hygiene.

- Concerns were raised about dormitory washroom hygiene. The Chairman explained that the water pump had been repaired, resolving the crisis in Campling House.
- The Yellow Fever vaccine was administered following a government directive.
- Parents were advised to submit their sons' medication to the school nurse on the first day of term.

8. Parental Involvement and Communication

- Members emphasized the need for greater parental involvement in students' academics and emotional well-being.
- Class WhatsApp groups were praised for enhancing communication, but concerns about inappropriate language were raised.
 - It was proposed and agreed that **all parallel WhatsApp groups be collapsed into one official group per class.**
 - The Headmaster reiterated that **official communication** would come directly from his office.
- Parents were reminded to respect the purpose of these platforms and maintain decorum.

	<p>9. Board Membership and Policy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A member proposed that non-married parents be allowed to serve on the PTA Executive. • The Headmaster, informed members that an institutional policy governs Board membership. <p>10. NIRA and National ID Registration</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Concerns were raised about the NIN registration process for S.3 students. • The Chairman advised that National Identification Numbers (NINs) should be obtained from NIRA offices. • A parent volunteered to liaise with NIRA to facilitate student registration. <p>11. Teacher Remuneration; A proposal was made to increase the salaries of Arts teachers by 100% to improve motivation and bridge the pay gap with Science teachers.</p> <p>12. Water Supply and Maintenance</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Members expressed concern over the sustainability of water supply in the school. • The Chairman reiterated that repairs had been made and that supply had stabilized. <p>13. PTA and AGM Scheduling; A member raised a concern regarding the simultaneous scheduling of the PTA meeting and Visitation. The matter was noted for future consideration.</p>

ACADEMICS

The students are taught very well by a committed and competent staff. The staff teach their lessons as expected with supervision made by the members of the Academic Department. To ensure we complete the syllabus in time we give extra lessons in the night and early morning preps. Where students are found to be lacking, they are given extra support through remedial lessons. We still have some boys who do not want to write notes, this we are discouraging it by ensuring that unless one has notes they are not given permission to write their examinations. Confirmation whether one has notes is by using a Notes checking form which must be filled by the subject teacher and finally endorsed by the class teacher who then issues an examination card.

Preparation of candidates

The candidates have been taught well, currently a very large majority of subjects have completed their examinations. For the few where the syllabus is not yet completed, we have made plans to support them so that they complete as soon as possible. The details of this plan will be provided to their parents in due course.

UCE results for last year

I am happy to inform you that the UCE results for last year were very good. We thank the staff for the good job they did to ensure our boys excel.

STUDENTS WELFARE

The boys are looked after very well by our competent and caring staff, we eat a variety of meals that include rice, posho, matooke, potatoes and cassava. Our source is mainly beans but we eat beef, ground nut stew and chicken. Our breakfast is mainly porridge with milk and bread or an egg are assured.

This year we are happy that we are baking all the bread we are eating at the college and some registered students at given times participate in the baking of bread and other confectioneries.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

At the College we groom leaders through the prefectorial body, students' council and the many clubs we have. This year we had our new prefects and students' council elected. The Head prefect is Wampamba Jordan Lukanga while the Chairman students' council is Ssesanga Rodney. The prefects are given training and they are continuously given guidance.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

We continue to nurture students spiritually through the daily masses we have, morning prayers, rosary during the month of the rosary and through religious movements. Those parents whose children have never got sacraments that they may qualify for should see Fr. Maweje Mathias, the chaplain, or Mr. Serubiri Adrian who is one of the members of the Chapel council. For the Anglicans who have not professed their solemn promises should also see Mr. Hasahya Titus, the patron of the Anglicans in the community.

CURRICULUM FAIR

This term the college held a curriculum fair where the boys showcased their knowledge, creativity and problem solving abilities through hands on projects. We appreciate the guest of honour, Mr. George Mutekanga who graced the day with his presence.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The college is lucky to have a lot of space for co-curricular activities;

Sports

The games we play include; Soccer, Rugby, Lawn tennis, Hockey, volleyball, badminton, Basketball, table tennis, cricket, American football, Scrabble, chess, athletics to mention but a few.

Within sports we qualified and got represented at district and National level in many sports disciplines. I am happy that at National we qualified with silver for Rugby, Bronze for both Scrabble and Lawn Tennis. For these three games we qualified to participate in the East African Games competitions in Kakamega Kenya. In case your son is to go for these games we shall request that you meet the Head of the sport department and sign a consent form allowing your son to travel outside Uganda. Any student whose parents may not have signed the consent form, that boy will be disqualified from the list of participants of the East African games.

Sports day;

I thank you dear parents who came and supported our sons on sports day, I congratulate parents of Hanlon house who took the trophy, the second house was Heweston which was followed by Billington house. The winning house won a bull, the second and third houses got three goats each. We thank the Assistant Commissioner general of Prisons, Mr. Hilary Bisanga who is also our parent, for having accepted to be a guest of honour and donated to us a bull. We also thank him for the words of wisdom he shared with the college community.

On sports day the Old boys of 1990-1996 donated to the college 14 tennis rackets and 200 tennis balls, in addition the are renovating the tennis courts. We thank them for this kind and loving gesture.

Fufa-TV cup

The college is participating in the FUFU-TV cup football tournament; this is a tournament of selected schools mainly traditional secondary schools. We have qualified to continue to the round of 32 and by virtue of this qualification FUFU management gave the college two sets of soccer jerseys.

CLUBS

The college has many clubs where we train students in leadership skills, creativity skills, communication skills, mobilization skills, teamwork to mention but a few. Though these clubs we get talks at assembly where the boys do peer guidance to their friends, we also engage in charitable activities that support internal and external causes.

Sometimes boys may ask for money to go for charitable trips or to attend functions that may be either internal or external. Kindly give them support but keep in mind that we should not support more than two club outings otherwise that boy may lose focus at school. We do not expect a boy to say I want money to donate to a charitable activity; they should make their savings from which they can donate. Only provide participation fees.

Debate

Namilyango College has over the years been a debate power house, we have wone a number of accolades this year the most recent is the trophy we lifted in Luweero recently. The boys within this club are trained in

public speaking and storytelling- they perform very well in this sector as well. Several accolades have been won in Speech making and storytelling.

DISCIPLINE

The discipline of the boys is very good by standards of a normal secondary school, to ensure the boys are disciplined they are given numerous guidance and motivational talks, they are guided through prayer and the many activities that exist at the College. In addition, we encourage the boys to air out their challenges through class meetings, house meetings also. Where we get discipline challenges, we invoke the school rules which we apply without putting special considering the parentage or origin of the boys. I encourage parents to accept the disciplinary decisions of the college management for we do it in favour of the college. I also call upon you to keep guiding the boys in terms of good behaviour, every chance you get please guide them.

HEALTH

The health of the boys is generally good; we thank our nurses who are doing a very good job. We apologize for the few cases where parents have been disappointed. We promise to keep improving in our management. I am happy to inform you that we recruited a male nurse and his coming brings the number of nurses to three.

We have noted that many parents pick their sons to take them for medical visits to doctors especially the boys who have braces. Kindly minimize the trips to your homes, let us try our best to do medical visits during the holidays. In case it happens though you can only report back with your sons during the week on a working day. In case a public holiday gets him home wait for a working day.

COUNSELLING SERVICES

The college continues to offer counselling services **to the boys, when counsellors come to the college, the boys may report there on their own or they may be recommended by their peers who have been trained to identify persons with challenges. In some cases the staff recommend boys for counselling services. In case we as a parent you think your son has a challenge do not hesitate to advise us on offering him specialized support.**

REPORTING DAY and RETURNING DAY

On these days we have started opening the gates at 6.00am, we start working at 7.00am to allow parents who are rushing to work report for duty. I wish to remind you that we normally have staff who guide the traffic flow, respect them and take the direction they have given you to take. Drive in single line you do not have to overtake within the college or on the road from seta. Sometimes we have unnecessary traffic congestion due to the impatience of some of the parents who drive on shoulders.

I also wish to inform you that by 9.30am almost all boys have been taken home. How I wish we could spread ourselves wider by some classes arriving at 11.00am others 1.00pm or after. In such a case we would have no traffic congestion on our college compound. We shall ensure we have other gates operate comfortably.

On the day you pick your boys please check and ensure all your son's property is taken, also ensure that what you take belongs to your son. We have had cases where parents return property that does not belong to their son when they picked it by accident.

Some parents have started a habit of dumping their sons at the gate on the day we return to school, some of the boys are those who have not paid fees but many times they have arrived late. In case any parent dumps their sons at the gate again we shall allow them to enter, get them a place to sleep and then the following day in the morning suspend that boy for two weeks.

NAMILYANGO COLLEGE PEREGRINE KIBUUKA ENDOWMENT FOUNDATION

This was started by the Board of Governors of the College and the Old boys of the College. It derives its name from a former Headmaster of Namilyango College, Dr. Peregrine Kibuuka, and it is intended collect resources, invest them and the proceeds are ploughed back to support the college in terms of

- paying school fees for needy, disciplined and academically excelling students
- provide equipment to the college
- support staff welfare
- support infrastructural development

This year the foundation made their maiden contribution when on Namilyango day, they donated 20 computers to the college and this has been followed by a 10 million contribution to needy students' fees. The ten million is to continue for every term until their income has grown to a more comfortable position.

Allow me to note that we have a number of students who are in need of school fees sometimes when the bread winner(s) of the family pass on or when the bread winner(s) lose their source of income. I therefore call upon all those persons of good will to support the Endowment Foundation to give a chance to more boys to benefit from the values the College offers to those who access its education environment.

I wish to note that before a boy gets sponsored by NACOFUND, a sponsorship committee is convened and look at available data which is used to generate a list, which list is forwarded to the management of the fund which makes a final decision. We thank you dear parents for the contribution you make to the fund.

SCHOOL FEES SUPPORT

In addition to Endowment Foundation, we have other persons or organization that support boys' education, allow me to recognize;

- the boys themselves who many times collect funds to pay school fees for one of their own when they discover he is challenged.
- The parents who come out and pledge to support needy children

COLLEGE FARM

The college farm has been supportive in terms of vegetables, tomatoes, milk and pork for those who can enjoy it. The boys are involved especially in keeping rabbits and mixing animal feeds.

On the farm we also have bananas and coffee which were planted for demonstration and possible income.

COOKED FOOD

The Ministry of Education and Sports among other things reminded schools of ferrying cooked food to schools. We implemented the directive and from today onwards we shall be inviting a service provider(s) who will be serving food at a fair price. Today service providers have been invited and their food will be at 20,000/- , kindly give us advise on how better we can manage this activity since it is the first time it is happening at the College.

DIY Practical skills training program

We continue to provide DIY Do-it-your-self program where parents pay 250,000/- for a particular skill. The skills include, Motor vehicle mechanics, electricity and solar equipment installation, electronics, coding, electronics and robotics and building construction. The program for S1 is on the time table and the boys are learning a lot. I encourage parents especially of S1 to give their boys a chance to gain those important life skill.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

In the previous meeting we had completed two levels of the new dormitory block and the Board had made a decision to complete the full plan of the third level. This level shall be completed and habited in term three. It would have been completed at the start of the term unfortunately we had to go through identification of new contractors hence the delay and when they started of the project again, they were delayed somewhere by harsh weather conditions and delayed supply of critical material.

We now anticipate that by the end of next month the building will be done and occupied at the start of third term. While we complete the dormitory project we are working hard to ensure that we conclude the contract of the contractor of the classroom block. We anticipate that the expansion of the A'level hostel will move concurrently with the classroom block project.

APPRECIATION

1. I thank the Government of Uganda for the support they give to the college especially paying salary of our staff on Government pay roll. This term we also got 17 laptops, a projector, projector screen and a printer in addition to some other related gadgets which are intended to improve the teaching and learning of science and mathematics in the college and some schools in our cluster centre in Mukono district.
2. The Board of Governors for the support they accord us in the management of the college.
3. The PTA executive for the usual support and guidance they give us while we execute our mandate as the leaders of the college.
4. The parents for entrusting us with their dear sons. and last but not the least the staff members for the commitment and love they exhibit while they do their work of educating the young boys.
5. All those persons and organisations who make donations to the college. We thank you very much.

1.0 Introduction:

Dear Family of Namilyango I greet you all, I welcome you to this P.T.A Annual General meeting. On behalf of the Board of Governors' Namilyango College and management, allow me to take you through the management financial report for the year ended 31st December 2024.

The report presented is prepared in accordance with the Simplified Guidelines on Budgeting, Accounting and Reporting for Secondary Schools 2017 and the Education Act, Cap 247.

It analyses the budget performance for the year 2024, which is prepared by management.

The Challenges were as below:

- i) Limited classroom space.
- ii) Insufficient water supply at the college due to multiple water pump break down.
- iii) High water bills from the National Water and Sewerage Corporation.

2.0 The population of 1,920 students was used as a basis of budgeting in 2024.



OPINION

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of Namilyango College School, for the year ended 31st December' 2024, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st December 2024, the Income and Expenditure Statement, and Cash Flow statement for the year then ended, together with other accompanying statements, notes and accounting policies.

In my opinion, the financial statements of Namilyango College School, for the year ended 31st December 2024 are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the Simplified Guidelines on Budgeting, Accounting and Reporting for Secondary Schools 2017 and the Education Act, Cap 247.

Basis for Opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs.). My responsibilities. Under report those standards are further described in the Auditor.'s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of my. I am independent of the School in accordance with the Constitution of the Republic of Uganda 1995 (as amended), the National Audit Act (NAA) Cap 170, the International Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions (INTOSAI) Code of Ethics, the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to my audit of the financial statements in Uganda. I have fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in my professional judgment, were of most significance in my audit of the financial statements of the current period. I have determined that there are no key audit matters to communicate in my report. The Accounting Officer is responsible for the Other Information. The Other Information comprises the statement of responsibilities of the Accounting Officer and the commentaries by the Head of Accounts and the Accounting Officer, other supplementary information. The Other Information does not include the financial statements and my auditors' report thereon. My opinion on the financial statements does not cover the Other Information and I do not express an audit opinion or any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with my audit of the financial statements, my responsibility is to read the Other Information and, in doing so, consider whether the Other Information is materially consistent with the financial statements or my knowledge obtained in the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work I have performed, I conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information; I am required to report that fact. I have nothing to report in this regard.

Management Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Recommendation

The Accounting Officer should engage the Ministry of Education and Sports and other responsible stakeholders to expedite the process to initiate the new member for the Board of Governor as appointed.



I am happy to report that we have served together with utmost professionalism, commitment and love for the College and our dear sons. I therefore thank you my dear friends for the sacrifices you have made in the last three years, the many journeys you have made to the College to come and ensure College Management gets the support we have been mandated to execute.

Allow me dear parents, to present to you some of the achievements we have had in the **last year**; Successfully catered for staff and students' welfare.

- We completed the two-level dormitory block where Kiwanuka and Billington houses now reside, and before next term starts the third level will be completed. This will help Management to further reduce on the congestion that remains the dormitories.
- Continued renovations on the boys' sleeping spaces and staff quarters as detailed below;
 - Mukasa house (dormitory blocks) and their places of convenience
 - Bierman's house – was worked on the roof, bathrooms, laundry area, ceiling etc and now the unrenovated dormitories are; Mckee, Doyle and Campling.
 - Four staff houses were given a major renovation that is B1, B6, and B7.

- Replaced;
 - old sewer lines that run through the play ground
 - a network of underground electric cables that runs all over the college compound
 - Replacement of water pipes that supply college with water (water pump)
- Installed CCTV cameras in all dormitories, dining hall and kitchen.
- Purchased 80 tablets to support e-learning and research, these are for S1.
- Constructed the playground drainage – The drainage system running throughout the playground to the lagoon
- Constructed part of the Perimeter wall as you go to Seeta.
- Supported the start and maintenance of the College bakery
- On a termly basis we have added the capacity of rain water harvest at the College, during the last holidays the capacity was increased by 40 cubic meters, (40000 litres).

Projects Planned for the Coming Year

- Completion of the dormitory block as detailed above
- Construction of a new classroom block that will include classrooms, science laboratories, a computer lab, a library, and office space.
- Expansion of the A-Level hostel through the addition of a new wing to increase accommodation capacity for the A-Level section. We are currently working closely with management to ensure that both this and other ongoing projects are implemented concurrently—without placing an undue financial burden on parents through increased school fees. Initial discussions have already begun regarding a potential strategic partnership with the National Housing and Construction Company Limited. This is one of the possible avenues being explored to ensure the project is completed within a short timeframe.
- Development of new sanitation facilities at the sports pitch to improve hygiene and convenience.

We sincerely thank the College Management and the entire staff for their dedication in taking excellent care of our sons and, most importantly, for their commitment to providing quality, value-based education.

To our fellow parents, thank you for your unwavering support to Management, which has contributed greatly to the smooth running of the College.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the Board members, with whom we've worked closely to ensure that Management receives the necessary support to steer the College forward.
